With the passage of the new Right-to-Work laws in Michigan, employers throughout the state - whether unionized or not - are realizing that the impact of these laws on their operations are more complicated and nuanced than initially believed.

 - Provide advice as to options for changing dues check-off forms, if needed.

The flat fee and scope of service will depend on the need involved, such as whether the employer is unionized or non-unionized and the number of union contracts at issue.
